## What is the FIRST® Tech Challenge Dean's List Award?

In an effort to recognize the leadership and dedication of the most outstanding secondary school *Students* from *FIRST*®, the Kamen family sponsors awards for selected 10th or 11th grade\* *Students* known as the *FIRST*® Robotics Competition and the *FIRST*® Tech Challenge *FIRST* Dean's List Award.

There are three (3) levels of FIRST Dean's List Award Students.

- 1. **FIRST Dean's List Semi-finalists** comprised of the two (2) *Students* in their 10th or 11th school year nominated by each *Team*.
- 2. FIRST Dean's List Finalists The Students selected for each Regional Championship.
- 3. *FIRST* Dean's List Winners comprised of the ten (10) *FIRST* Robotics Competition and ten (10) *FIRST* Tech Challenge *Students* selected from the applicable *FIRST* Dean's List Finalists.

The students who earn *FIRST* Dean's List Award status as either a Semi-finalist, Finalist or Winner, are great examples of student leaders who have led their teams and communities to increased awareness for *FIRST* and its mission, champion *FIRST* Core Values such as <u>Inclusion</u>, and embody *Gracious Professionalism*<sup>®</sup>. It is the goal of *FIRST* that Dean's List Award Winners will continue, postaward, as great leaders, <u>student alumni</u>, and advocates of *FIRST*.

In 2019, the <u>Woodie Flowers Memorial Grant</u> was established for Dean's List Award Winners pursuing STEAM fields of study.

## **Student Eligibility**

Every registered *FIRST* Tech Challenge team can submit up to two (2) students as *FIRST* Dean's List Award semi-finalists.

• Students must be a sophomore (grade 10) or junior (grade 11) to be eligible for this award.

\*Note: For regions of the world that do not use grade levels such as this to identify years of schooling: This award is intended for students who are two (2) to three (3) years away from entering college or university. Students that would be attending college or university in the next academic year are not eligible. Mentors will be asked for the year of graduation during the nomination process.

• The coach or mentor nominating the student(s) must submit an essay explaining why the student should receive this award. The essay must be 4,000 characters or less.

## **Dean's List Award Criteria**

Criteria for selection of the FIRST Dean's List Award shall include, but not be limited to a student's:

- Demonstrated leadership and commitment to the FIRST Core Values
- Effectiveness at increasing awareness of FIRST in their school and community
- Demonstrates passion for a long-term commitment to FIRST
- The student's individual contributions to their team contribute to the overall success of the team
- Proven experience in areas of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM)
- The student is a role model and can motivate and lead fellow team members

## **Dean's List Events**

New in the 2025-2026 season, Program Delivery Partners are no longer required to create their own Dean's List Interview Only event. Events will be created by *FIRST* for all regions prior to Kickoff. All regions will follow the same deadline for all Dean's List nominations, as outlined in the next section.

Program Delivery Partners, however, must access their Dean's List event using the *FIRST* Tech Challenge scoring system to set up the window in which the region will be holding interviews. The interview windows must only happen within the date ranges of December 15, 2025 through February 15<sup>th</sup>, 2026. Please be aware that Finalists are due to *FIRST* on February 15<sup>th</sup>, so interviews should be schedule prior to this date to provide enough time for finalist selection.

To select the window for your region, please see <u>Dean's List Events - Editing Interview Dates</u> section of this document for step-by-step instructions.

## What is the Deadline for Team Nominations?

The deadline for all teams to nominate students is December 15th, 2025 at 11:59pm Eastern time.




## **Dean's List Award Evaluation Structure**

The chart below is a visual aid to show how each category feeds into specific levels of competition, starting with the coach making the nominations. Dean's List interviewers are responsible for interviewing semi-finalists (nominees). Interviews are done either in person at a traditional event, or remotely (this will be region dependent, please check with your local program delivery partner). The Dean's List reviewer will then review the nominations and the interviewer notes within a state/region to determine which students will move to the next level as Dean's List finalists. Depending upon the size of the region, there will be 2-4 Dean's List finalists within each state or region (see <a href="Number of Advancing Finalists by Region">Number of Advancing Finalists by Region</a> for further details). These finalists will be announced at the Regional Championship Tournament. A separate panel called the Dean's List Award Committee will review the Dean's List finalists and choose the 10 FIRST Tech Challenge Dean's List winners.

## **Dean's List Volunteer Roles**

#### **Overview**

There are two volunteer roles that are required to evaluate the Dean's List Award; the Dean's List Interviewer and the Dean's List Reviewer.

#### Dean's List Interviewer

Dean's List Interviewers main responsibility is to interview semi-finalists; however, there are other responsibilities the interviewer must take on before and after the event. These responsibilities include:

- Review nominations prior to the event.
- Interview the Semi-finalist during the event.
- Write a narrative about the interview after the event.

The Dean's List interviewer is not responsible for selecting the finalists for their region. Interviewers gather information to pass along to the Dean's List Reviewers via a written narrative to assist the Reviewers in their role of selecting the region's Finalists.

#### **Dean's List Reviewer**

The Dean's List Reviewers are responsible for selecting the Dean's List Award Finalists. There will be at least two reviewers in a region that work together to select the finalists for that particular region. The reviewers must access the <u>Judges Portal</u> to view the original nomination as well as the notes from the Dean's List interviewers. Once all of the nominations and notes have been taken into consideration, the reviewers are responsible for choosing the number of Finalists allocated for that region. Dean's List reviewers do not need to be present at the event; rather they review each semi-finalist and enter the Finalists in the <u>Judges Portal</u>. This information will feed up to the regional championship PDP.

## **Number of Advancing Finalists by Region**

The number of semi-finalists that will move onto the next level as finalists depends upon the region. Regions with larger team numbers will have additional spots to advance students. Prior to the start of each season, finalist numbers are reevaluated. The following chart shows how finalist numbers are determined:

## **Judges Portal**

The Judges Portal is the tool used to track nominations, interviewers' notes, and selected finalists. https://my.firstinspires.org/Judging/ See the Judges Portal Instructions for more details.

#### Partner Access to the Portal

Program delivery partners have been granted access to the portal and should be able to view all of their events within the region. This will allow each partner to track the nominations, recruit enough volunteers based on the number of nominations, and ensure that notes have been submitted for each nomination.

## **Granting Access to Volunteers**

In order to allow a volunteer access to the portal, they must first apply to the role of Dean's List interviewer or Dean's List reviewer in the <u>Volunteer Registration System</u>. Once they have applied, they must be assigned by the PDP or volunteer coordinator to the role in the Volunteer Management System (VMS). The assignment in the VMS is what grants the Volunteer access to the Judges Portal.

Once the volunteer has been assigned to the role, they will only be able to access the event in which they have been assigned.

**Note:** If the Volunteer will be fulfilling the role at multiple events, they must be assigned to each event.

## **Recruiting Volunteers**

Since partners have access to all nominations within their region, they should be sure to check the number of nominations when the nomination timeframe closes. Knowing how many nominations there are for an event is necessary to recruit enough volunteers to interview the semi-finalists.

#### **Recruiting Interviewers**

Dean's List interviewers have two very important responsibilities: interviewing the semi-finalist and writing up notes after the interview. When recruiting for this position, keep in mind that the interviewer should have strong writing skills, and experience with interviewing is preferred. College admissions officers, or someone in a similar field, would make a great interviewer.

At a minimum, there must be two Interviewers on staff to conduct Dean's List interviews. A panel of two interviewers should be able to interview up to five Semi-finalists. If there are more than five interviews, an additional panel of interviewers may be needed.

### **Recruiting Reviewers**

The reviewers have the important task of reading through multiple nominations, notes from the interviewers, and making a decision on which candidates should move to the next level of competition as finalists. There are no rules that state an interviewer cannot serve as a reviewer, however it's important to remind them to keep an open mind to all of the candidates and choose the candidates that most closely match the award criteria.

There must be at least two reviewers assessing the candidate's essays and interview notes. Some regions choose to form a committee to work through all the nominations and make the decision on the Finalists.

## **Recognition at Events**

## **Semi-finalist Recognition**

Students nominated as semi-finalists should be proud of their accomplishments and should be recognized for these accomplishments. Below are two ways to recognize semi-finalists at the event.

#### **Semi-finalist Pins**

FIRST has created semi-finalist pins to be given out to students interviewed at an event. These can either be provided after the interview, or if the PDP chooses, can be handed out at the closing ceremony to recognize the student in front of their peers.

**NOTE**: The pins will be mailed in December 2025 directly to the Program Delivery Partners. PDPs should arrange to have pins sent to their event hosts who have Dean's List Semi-finalists at their event.

#### **Closing Ceremonies Recognition**

PDP's and event hosts are encouraged to invite their semi-finalists to the center stage for recognition at the closing ceremonies if time allows. This is a very public way for the student to be recognized for their nomination. Some events also choose to announce the names of the semi-finalists and have them stand in the audience for applause. This should only be done at qualifying tournaments or league

tournaments. The awards scripts created for the Emcee include a script for the Dean's List semi-finalists.

However, inviting students to the stage should **not** be done at a Regional Championship Tournament. Since Finalists are announced at the State/Region Championship, the Semi-finalist(s) that do not advance should not have to walk off the stage after not moving to the next level. Only do this at Qualifying Tournaments or League Tournaments.

#### **Finalist Recognition Certificates**

Each Finalist should receive a certificate in honor of their achievements. FIRST will send out the appropriate number of finalist certificates to each region along with certificate folders to present to the finalists at the award ceremonies. The event host or PDP will need to fill in the finalist's name and the date of the event prior to passing out the certificate. ## Dean's List Award FAQ's

# Can a student be nominated for both *FIRST* Tech Challenge and *FIRST* Robotics Competition Dean's List?

Both *FIRST* Robotics Competition and *FIRST* Tech Challenge students are eligible to be nominated as a Dean's List semi-finalist within their program. There are no rules that state that a student that participates in both programs cannot be nominated for the Dean's List for both programs.

#### Do Semi-finalists get a second interview at the Regional Championship?

No, semi-finalists for *FIRST* Tech Challenge will only have one interview before the regional championship tournament.

#### Do Finalists get a second interview at the FIRST Championship?

No. The Dean's List Award Committee for *FIRST* Tech Challenge reviews all the finalists nominations essays and interviewer notes prior to the *FIRST* Championship. The winners of the award are selected prior to the event and announced at the *FIRST* Championship.

#### Can Submissions Be Made Past the Deadline?

There will be no exceptions to the deadline. *FIRST* Tech Challenge will not accept submissions after the deadline unless there is a verifiable issue with the Team's dashboard. Please forward any requests to FTCDeansList@firstinspires.org.




2022 Dean's List Award Summary



**Important:** If a preferred name is present, please be sure to use the preferred name when addressing the student during their interview.






#### **Select Finalists**

Finalists will receive a notification email from *FIRST* after the event has taken place, and after the student has been announced as a finalist at the regional championship.



## Dean's List Events - Editing Interview Dates


To edit the dates in your Dean's List Interview event, follow these steps:

- 1. Log into <a href="https://ftc-scoring.firstinspires.org">https://ftc-scoring.firstinspires.org</a>
- 2. Select your region using the hyperlink once you are logged in.

3. Select your Dean's List Interviews event from the event list. Note that prior to selecting your interview date window, this will show "Unscheduled".





4. Once the Dean's List Interviews event is selected, the following popup window will appear. Enter the interview start date, interviews end date, and your local time zone.

Some important things to consider when selecting your dates:


- a. If the date range is more than 7 days, only the last 7 days will be visible in VMS, Event Search Results, and in the Volunteer dashboard.
- b. Finalists are due to *FIRST* on February 15<sup>th</sup>, 2026. Make sure to provide enough time for interviews to be completed, and for the Dean's List Reviewers to make Finalists selections prior to the deadline.




